

Professor Scott Fraley attended college at the University of Texas at Austin, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree with honors in 1982 from the Plan II Liberal Arts Honors Program. Fraley then completed law school at the University of Texas School of Law in 1985 where he was a member of the Texas Law Review.
