

Mike Rubin is one of the leaders of the multi-state law firm of McGlinchey Stafford PLLC, heads his firm's appellate practice team. He has presented over 400 major papers in the U.S., Canada, and England on legal ethics, appellate law, finance, real estate, and legal writing. He is a past-President of the Bar Association of the U.S. Fifth Circuit, the American College of Real Estate Lawyers, and the U.S. Fifth Circuit Bar Association. He serves as a Life Member of the American Law Institute, is a Commissioner for the Uniform Law Commission (the organization that writes the UCC and other uniform laws), and is a member of the American Academy of Appellate Lawyers. For more than three decades, he also has served as an Adjunct Professor teaching courses in finance, real estate, and advanced legal ethics at the law schools at LSU, Tulane, and Southern University. He is an author, co-author, and contributing writer of thirteen books and over thirty articles; his works are used in law schools and have been cited as authoritative by state and federal trial and appellate courts. Mike has been honored as the Distinguished Alumnus by the LSU Law School and as the 2012 Distinguished Attorney of Louisiana by the Louisiana State Bar Foundation. Mike's latest legal book, on Louisiana finance and real estate, is "Louisiana Security Devices, a Précis." Mike's debut novel, a legal thriller entitled *The Cottoncrest Curse*, was recognized at last year's annual meeting of the American Library Association as the best thriller/suspense novel published by a university or independent press. The book has gone international, with a German-language edition released this summer.
